

2023-2024 Tuition Information

Tuition includes daily lunch and snacks, books and class trips for all Experiential School students.

Submitting an enrollment contract obligates you for the full year's tuition unless you notify the school in writing prior to July 1, 2023 that your student will not be attending Shorecrest during the 2023-2024 school year.

Deposit: \$1,000 (*applied towards tuition*)

All payment plans require a non-refundable tuition deposit of \$1,000 per student, due upon enrollment to reserve a space in the class.

Annual Plan Tuition:

1 payment due May 2023

Alpha and JK:

\$20,020

Semi-Annual Plan Tuition:

2 payments: 60% due May 2023, 40% due Oct 2023

\$20,420

Monthly Plan Tuition:

10 payments due May 2023 - Feb 2024

Shorecrest accepts payments made by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) from a checking or savings account or by credit card (subject to a 2.95% convenience fee) directly to FACTS Tuition Management. Shorecrest also accepts payments made via personal check, cashier's check, bank check or money order.

Late Payments:

All charges, including tuition, must be kept current. A late fee will be assessed if payments are not made as scheduled in FACTS.

Tuition Refund Insurance:

Families are automatically enrolled in the Tuition Refund Insurance plan unless they choose to opt-out during the re-enrollment process, if eligible.

Tuition Refund Insurance (2.4% of tuition cost) is **required** if the Semi-Annual Plan or Monthly Tuition Plan is selected AND one of the following is true:

- a new family enrolling a student in Shorecrest for the first time
- a new student enrolling after the school year has begun
- a student returning to the school after an absence of one semester or more

Enrollment contracts obligate families to pay the full year's tuition unless the school is notified in writing prior to **July 1, 2023** that your student will not be attending Shorecrest during the 2023-2024 school year. Insurance is especially beneficial for those who may be relocating or may need to withdraw a student for any reason during the school year.

2023-2024 Additional Fees/Expenses - **Mandatory**

Daily lunch and snacks, books and class trips for all Experiential School students are included in tuition.

Application Fee: \$75; International \$200. Other international tuition and fees may apply. Please contact the Admissions Office for current information and rates.

Matriculation Fee: \$400. Assessed for new students and returning students who have previously withdrawn.

Backpacks: \$30-\$60. All students are required to carry a school-approved backpack. There are two approved options, one from Lands' End, one from Jansport. See Handbook for details.

SCA: All Shorecrest families are automatically members of the Shorecrest Community Association (SCA). There are no additional membership fees.

Personal items: <\$50. Project tee shirts, water bottle, snack bag, and quiet time items.

Additional Fees/Expenses - **Optional**

After School Clubs and Programs: After school programs focus on enrichment, athletic and academic development. All programs meet from 3pm - 4pm. There are four six-week sessions per year. After the program, children may go home or to Extended Day, if purchased – see below.

Extended Day: Extended Day is designed to provide a safe, nurturing and enjoyable environment for students who require supervision beyond school hours on a regular basis.
