

2023-2024 Tuition Information

Tuition includes daily lunch for all Middle School students.

Submitting an enrollment contract obligates you for the full year's tuition unless you notify the school in writing prior to July 1, 2023 that your student will not be attending Shorecrest during the 2023-2024 school year.

Deposit: \$1,000 (*applied towards tuition*)

All payment plans require a non-refundable tuition deposit of \$1,000 per student, due upon enrollment to reserve a space in the class.

Shorecrest accepts payments made by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) from a checking or savings account or by credit card (subject to a 2.95% convenience fee) directly to FACTS Tuition Management. Shorecrest also accepts payments made via personal check, cashier's check, bank check or money order.

Late Payments:

All charges, including tuition, must be kept current. A late fee will be assessed if payments are not made as scheduled in FACTS.

Tuition Refund Insurance:

Families are automatically enrolled in the Tuition Refund Insurance plan unless they choose to opt-out during the re-enrollment process, if eligible.

Tuition Refund Insurance (2.4% of tuition cost) is **required** if the Semi-Annual Plan or Monthly Tuition Plan is selected AND one of the following is true:

- a new family enrolling a student in Shorecrest for the first time
- a new student enrolling after the school year has begun
- a student returning to the school after an absence of one semester or more

Enrollment contracts obligate families to pay the full year's tuition unless the school is notified in writing prior to **July 1, 2023** that your student will not be attending Shorecrest during the 2023-2024 school year. Insurance is especially beneficial for those who may be relocating or may need to withdraw a student for any reason during the school year.

2023-2024 Additional Fees/Expenses - **Mandatory**

Daily lunch for all Middle School students is included in tuition.

Application Fee: \$75; International \$200. Other international tuition and fees may apply. Please contact the Admissions Office for current information and rates.

Matriculation Fee: \$400. Assessed for new students and returning students who have previously withdrawn.

Books: estimated \$400. Textbooks, workbooks and computer software applications are purchased by the parents through an online bookstore. Learn more: www.shorecrest.org > Parents > Parent Area.

SCA: All Shorecrest families are automatically members of the Shorecrest Community Association (SCA). There are no additional membership fees.

School Supplies: estimated \$100. A supply listing is provided to parents to purchase each summer.

School Uniforms: School uniforms are purchased through Lands' End. The Shorecrest Community Association (SCA) also holds used uniform sales.

Technology Expenses:

Fifth Grade and NEW Middle School Students are issued a school iPad for use throughout Middle School. An annual technology fee of **\$375** will be billed to the family each August. The technology fee covers the iPad, an extended warranty, a keyboard case, all productivity and curricular iOS applications needed by the students, software to manage the device, and a Help Desk to support students and families. Sixth Grade returning students are charged **\$375** in August for continued use of their school-issued device. Students will turn in their devices at the end of the school year and are issued a new device the following year.

Seventh Grade returning students will be issued a new iPad with a new case for the next two years. More information on the device refresh will be included with the Start of School documents in July 2023. An annual technology fee of **\$375** will be billed in August.

Eighth Grade returning students are charged **\$375** in August for continued use of their school-issued device. The school-issued device will be returned to Shorecrest at the end of the school year.

Additional Fees/Expenses - **Optional**

After School Homework Support (Middle School After Hours): After school programs are available to Middle School students to provide homework help, organizational support, social and emotional development, and enrichment. All programs meet at the end of the school day, and support is available until 5:30pm. Sessions align with athletic seasons. The program prices vary. Athletics: Athletic activity fees are assessed per team/sport.

Field Experience Trips: Participation in these annual programs is encouraged but is not mandatory. 5th & 6th Grade \$350, 7th Grade (St. Augustine) \$775, and 8th Grade (Washington, DC) \$1,900.
